# **Adult Options in Education - Hopkins**

## Award Amount \$121,500.00 Primary Program Contact: Chelsea Ritland

The target populations who will benefit from the IELCE program activities are: (1) foreign-born adult learners applying for US Citizenship, (2) English Language Learners (ELLs) seeking workforce training, adult literacy skills, and workforce preparation in the West Metro, and (3) Intermediate level EL students receiving civics education. The goals of the IELCE activities proposed are to: 1) provide English language acquisition instruction; 2) offer civics education on the rights and responsibilities of citizens; and 3) offer career training including integrated education and training on in-demand occupations and industries.

This grant will allow Great Rivers to serve a larger population of the community and offer opportunities to English Language Learners in the areas of community involvement, college preparation, digital literacy and job skills training in order to further support their personal, educational and career goals. It will also provide them with the opportunity to find ways to use education and training obtained in their country of origin more effectively.

# **Hmong Cultural Center**

Hmong Cultural Center will offer a class focusing on Workplace English and Civic Engagement with a training component emphasizing the English needed for Health Care and Personal Care Assistant (PCA) jobs. As part of

the programming, Hmong Cultural Center will partner with the local CareerForce Center to offer workshops and provide guest speakers on developing work readiness skills, job search strategies, and on how to use the state's job search website. Staff will attempt to help match program participants with available openings in health care related fields. Hmong Cultural Center will also partner with the Karen Ministry at First Baptist Church in Saint Paul as part of program outreach to recruit class participants.

# **International Institute of Minnesota (IIMN)**

By integrating an English language curriculum with workforce training and job readiness skills, IIMN's New American students can develop their English language proficiency concurrently with industry-specific skills development for the hospitality and healthcare sectors, leading to increased community engagement as well as improved employment and wage outcomes. Finally, funding would allow the English For Work and Hospitality Career Pathway staff to develop and instruct new Hospitality courses that will offer students advanced, focused skills training to improve employment and wage outcomes.

# **Neighborhood House**

A grant of \$100,000 will provide funding to offer two daily in-person classes and one online class, serving a total 100 participants annually. These classes will be for students looking for work. A program like this will allow students to enter into employment or progress to more advanced training programs. The classes offered will focus on English language acquisition and citizenship topics, and incorporate a job apprenticeship in customer service and classroom study of English for the workplace. Students in this training will also have the opportunity to participate in a monthly service learning opportunity.

The skills students gain in these apprenticeships will provide an excellent introduction to one of Neighborhood House's onsite career trainings, Public Sector Administration.
